Study Abroad Fees

Study Abroad fees for 2017 are: \$8,000 per semester for 4 units of study and \$A6,400 for 3 units of study.

Unit selection/ Credit transfer

Exchange and Study Abroad students can take units from any of our Colleges.*

Students must list their preferred units of study as requested in the Victoria Abroad application form.

To meet the Australian Student Visa requirements, students must enrol in a minimum of 3 units. VU will permit a maximum of 5 units. 4 units are considered a full-time load (48 VU credit points). As a guide, 1 VU unit is equivalent to 12 VU credit points.

Visa information	Exchange and study abroad students will need to apply for a <u>student visa (subclass 500)</u> . They require a CoE (Confirmation of Enrolment) from Victoria University.		
	This is issued after receipt of the student's acceptance form and after payment of the tuition fees, in the case of Study Abroad.		
	Students from certain countries may be able to apply for a working holiday visa instead of a student visa. Students applying for a working holiday visa do not require a CoE.
