About Duksung

The school was first established in 1920, as part of the drive for improved education which arose out of the March 1st Movement. Its founder was Ms. Cha Mirisa, an educator and leader of the Joseon Women's Education Society. At the time it was known as the Geunhwa Academy.

In 1950 Duksung was established as a junior college, two years later it was restructured into a 4 year university. In 1984, the main campus was moved to its present location in Dobong-gu, Seoul.

Currently there are approximately 6,400 undergraduates, 400 graduate students, 570 faculty members and 100 staff members.

Free intensive Korean language courses	Exchange students at Duksung can take up to 4 semesters of intensive Korean courses at our International Language Center without any additional tuition.
International Buddy	Each international student studying at Duksung will have a designated buddy - who are volunteering students of Duksung. They will introduce you to campus life and help you adjust to Korean culture and language
