If the mark for a subject is more than $10 / 20$, they get the credits.
If the weighted average is $>10 / 20$, they get 30 credits per semester even if some subjects are under 10.

| A | 10 | EXCELLENT - outstanding performance with only minor errors |
| B | 25 | VERY GOOD - above the average standard but with some errors |
| C | 30 | GOOD - generally sound work with a number of notable errors |
| D | 25 | SATISFACTORY - fair but with significant shortcomings |
| E | 10 | SUFFICIENT - performance meets the minimum criteria |
| FX | - | FAIL - some more work required before the credit can be awarded |
| F | - | FAIL - considerable further work is required |
