Registration	<b>Course offer:</b> the list of courses offered can be found on the document attached. In addition to the IBBA courses students can choose to take courses from the KEDGE Bachelor programme, and mix courses from bot programmes, depending on their level of studies.						
	<b>Course workload</b> : The usual workload for a regular Kedge student is 6 courses (30 ECTS) per semestrer. However, as for incoming students, the home institution decides on the number of credits to be completed by its own students (with a minimum of 4 courses and a maximum of 30 ECTS of business courses per semester).						
	<b>Course timetable:</b> the information regarding the time (morning/afternoon or evening) for each course is specified into the online course selection application and in the student web page (Campus Virtuel) once the courses are selected.
