## 7 reasons to choose iCLA

**Experience Japan while Studying in English:** All courses at iCLA are taught in English (except Japanese language courses).

## Study Period at iCLA

You can choose to study at iCLA for 1 or 2 semester(s). Extension of study period - from 1 to 2 semester(s) - is available.

#### **Academic Calendar at iCLA**

**Spring Semester:** Early April to the end of July. (Exam period typically ends in early August).

Fall Semester: Early September to December (Exam period typically ends in the 4th week of December). Winter Break: January to March.

## **Tuition Fees**

Exchange students will pay full tuition fees to their home institution. Based on the exchange agreement, tuition fees at iCLA during the exchange program are 100% waived.

\*Please note that all the other fees and costs must be covered by the exchange students.

## **National Health Insurance**

Japan National Health Insurance is mandatory for those who are staying in Japan over 90 days. The premium (after applying for a special student discount) will be about 15 USD per month.

# iCLA Exchange Program Requirements & Required Documents

## **Minimum Requirements for Eligibility**

- 1. Completed at least one academic year at home institution
- 2. Cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or equivalent (some exceptions may be allowed)
- 3. TOEFL score: 213 (CBT), 550 (PBT), 80 (iBT); Cambridge FCE or equivalent

(Required for non-native English-speakers)

4. Two signed recommendation letters from home institution

#### **Required Documents**

- 1. Passport Copy (photo page)
- 2. Form 1: Application for Study Abroad at iCLA
- 3. Form 2: Faculty Recommendation Letters (two copies required)
- 4. Form 3: Statement of Purpose
- 5. Form 4: Study Plan at iCLA
- 6. Form 5: Mental Health History and Class Assistance
- 7. Certificate of English Language Proficiency (For non-native English-speakers only)
- 8. All Post-secondary Academic Transcript(s) in English

**How to Apply:** Submit the designated forms and required documents to the international office at the home institution. Incomplete applications cannot be processed. Please check ALL of the required documents before submitting.

## **Obtaining a Student Visa**

First, iCLA requires a signed Confirmation and Agreement Letter for entering into the Study Abroad Program at iCLA before iCLA can start assisting in the visa application.

There are 2 steps in an actual visa application process.

- 1) Apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) Only iCLA can apply on the behalf of the student in Japan. Please make sure to submit all the required documents by the specified date to the iCLA study abroad office.
- 2) Once the CoE is issued, it will be mailed to the student's home institution. The student should collect the original CoE and then apply for a visa at the nearby Japanese Embassy/Consulate General.
